



WebQuest materials as a result of collaboration between CSOs and teachers

When you connect organizations and their similar and related project activities, the results are never questionable. Thus, two civil society organizations joined the Erasmus + Peerment project - Youth Association Breza, a partner in the project, and the Nansen Dialogue Center Osijek as a participant in education and training for teachers and trainers (local test groups) in developing WebQuest materials on sustainable development. The link was the Nansen project UZBRDO - Teaching Imagining Choosing Growing Acting Sustainable, which is implemented by the Croatian-Swiss Cooperation Program, whose activities were related to training for experts, the so-called peermentoring. At a time when schools were closing their doors due to the global pandemic caused by the COVID-19 virus, educators and teachers didn't forget to use technologies and tools available. They decided to motivate, support and encourage their students to further develop their knowledge and skills.

Attached is WebQuest material created as a result of a collaboration between educators, teachers and volunteers, intended for primary and secondary school students.

Another example of WebQuest comes from Osijek Medical School and their professor Mirela Grubišić as trainees and educators of local test groups. This material was created but also realized while the students were still in their classrooms and when activism in local communities was realized on the ground. Nonetheless, this time nothing was possible without technologies and useful search links/connections.
